Did you know...

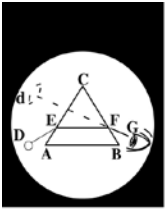
Were you aware that we are approaching our 100th anniversary in as little as 4 years? In honor of our upcoming anniversary we will be including a short biography section highlighting one of our past presidents each month. This month's spotlight is on our first president: Perley Gilman Nutting. Perley Gilman Nutting (1873–1949) was the founder of the Optical Society of America and served as its first president from 1916-1917.

It was November 18, 1915 when nine Rochester scientists met at the University of Rochester: four from Eastman Kodak Co., four from Bausch & Lomb, and one from the University. They met again a week later, and again on December 7th, when they formed an Optical Society and named it "The Rochester Association for Advancement of Applied Optics." On January 4, 1916, they held their first meeting.

Upon multiple requests from "optics types" elsewhere to join,^{1,2} Perley Gilman Nutting was more than willing to adapt the constitution and by-laws to form a national society. By doing this they established the first OSA Local Section in 1916, in Rochester, New York (USA). Ninety years later the OSA has evolved into the professional home for 14,000 optical physicists and engineers around the globe, with thousands of individual section members located in OSA Local Sections around the world. In recognition of its global reach and focus, since 2008 the Society has been known as OSA—The Optical Society.

Perley Gilman Nutting (1873–1949) was the founder of the Optical Society of America and served as its first president from 1916-1917.

- 1897 Ph.D. Cornell University
- 1899 University of California: Academic Colleges: Master Graduate
- 1899 Stanford University
- 1903 Physicist with the U.S. Bureau of Standards, Washington D.C.
- 1903 Optical engineer, Eastman Kodak Co. Residence, 11 Fair View Heights, Rochester, N.Y.
- 1904 Constructed one of the earliest, if not the first, neon sign, which was displayed at the Louisiana Purchase Exposition; however, this story has been disputed³
- 1906 Ph.D., 3 Kodak Park, Rochester, N. Y.
- 1910 Staff member at Eastman Kodak Company
- 1912 George Washington University, Ph.D. Assistant Professor of Physics
- 1912 Author of "Outlines of Applied Optics"
- 1917 Director of Research at Westinghouse, Pittsburgh, P.A.
- 1924 Geophysicist with the Geological Survey
- 1943 Retired
